At the **September 1, 2011 SBMS meeting** we will have a planning session for the second half of the ARRL 10 GHz and Up Contest plus discussion of results of the first half of the contest. The SBMS meets at the American Legion Hall 1024 Main Street (south of the 91 freeway) in Corona, CA at 1900 hours local time on the first Thursday of each month.

Last meeting: Mel, WA6JBD lead a planning session for the first part of the ARRL 10 GHz and up contest. A number of members were on hand to plan where they were going to be. Wayne, N6BN brought us discussion on the ARRL band planning efforts for the microwave area of spectrum. Thoughts were that Congress mandated 500 MHz re-designated would include the 3.3-3.5 GHz ham band. A number of links for the radio systems like Cactus could be affected by the spectrum re-designated frequencies. Going to "broadband.gov" will bring you to a government page that talks to the Congress plan directed to the FCC where "every American will".... have access to their government in action. The smart grid... universal service. and inter carrier compensation reform. If you want to see more go to" reboot.fcc.gov" to see spectrum dashboard where the 500 MHz or spectrum takeaway is discussed. ARRL is trying to get a handle on how much spectrum the amateur uses in main band plans and the "secret" links of systems like Cactus and other networks. The FCC is under the Congress gun to make this happen and soon is byword. Brian, AF6NA indicated that Hamcon in Torrance in September needs some microwave talks. 18 people present.
